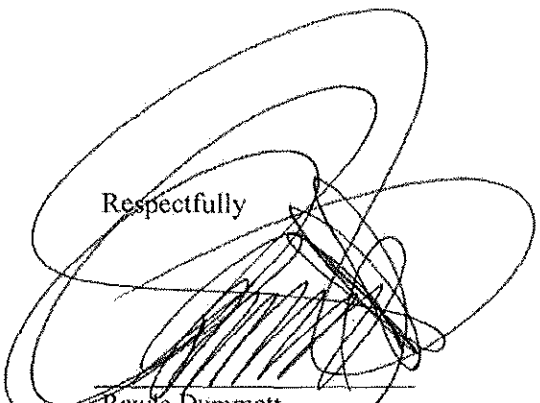

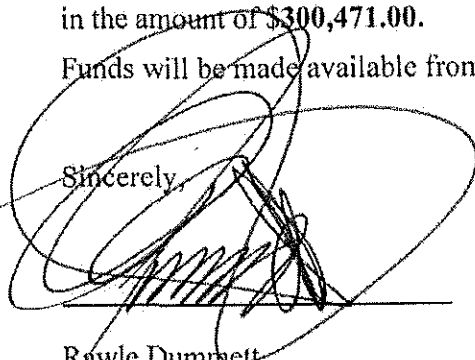

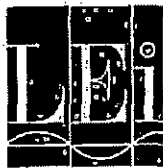

On March 17, 2022, the Town of Waterford opened bids for the above referenced project; with five bids received as follows:

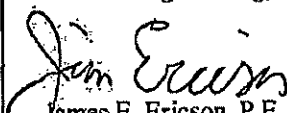

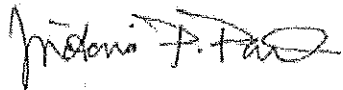

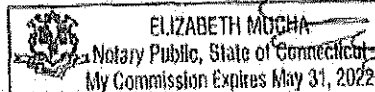

The Public Works Department is requesting an appropriation of \$1,705,358 from the CNR Undesignated Fund #205-31520 to resurface several roads. This request substitutes Gardiners Woods Road for Oil Mill Road. If approved, please forward to the Board of Finance for further consideration.

The Department is also requesting that this project be treated as one project and not be broken into the individual roads. Although the Department is confident in the estimates, this will allow flexibility if one road comes under and funds are needed to complete another on the list.

Background:

The Department had presented to the Boards and RTM a resurfacing project that would address the following roads;

- Lakes Pond (PCI = 60)
- Butlertown (PCI = 58)
- Daniels (PCI = 62)
- Niantic River Road (portion of) (PCI = 55)
- Oil Mill Road (PCI = 56)

The funds for these roads were placed into a CNR Undesignated Fund project line item. The Department is recommending that instead of resurfacing Oil Mill Road, the conditions on Gardiner's Wood Road (PCI = 52) have greater needs that must be addressed.

The condition of Gardiners Wood Road had deteriorated to a point where the Department must continuously expend resources to keep the road in a passable condition. When a road surface reaches a point where there are patches on patches and nothing is stable, it must be addressed not as spot repairs anymore, but as a resurfacing project. As part of this project, in the northern section, the Department will place several small diameter pipes under the road and raise the road by several inches in an attempt to keep the water off the road.

Although Oil Mill Road will still need to be addressed, there are several projects that would impact the timing when the resurfacing of Oil Mill should take place. On the section north of Parkway North there is the construction of the solar field. The Department has concerns that the truck traffic may affect the condition of the existing pavement. The construction of this site should be completed before any road work on this portion of Oil Mill Road is attempted.

On the section south of Parkway South there is a potential development in the vicinity of Gurley and Oil Mill Road. This development, Stone Ridge Business Park proposes to provide water and sewer to the site by trenching 600 (+/-) feet south on Oil Mill Road to the existing water and sewer lines. This development is in the planning and permitting phase. Again, this work should be completed before any road work on this portion of Oil Mill Road is attempted.

The Department current estimates are:

- Lakes Pond \$175,265
- Butlertown \$571,468
- Daniels \$263,705
- Niantic River Road (portion of) \$350,795
- Gardiners Wood Road \$344,125

Oil Mill Road will be placed in the FY 24 Capital Program for resurfacing

Public Works requests to be on the next Board of Selectman's meeting and have this project forwarded to the Board of Finance, if approved.

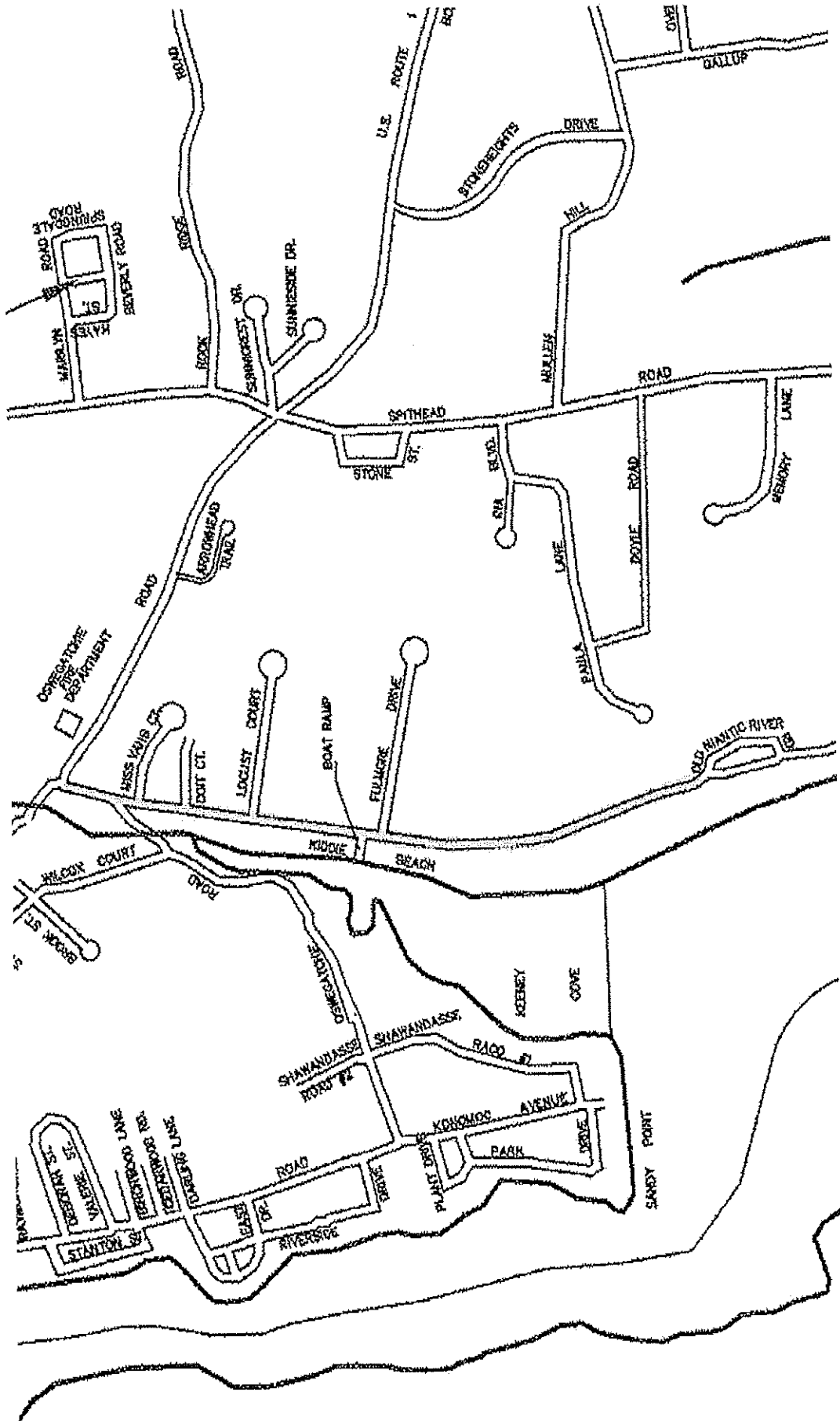

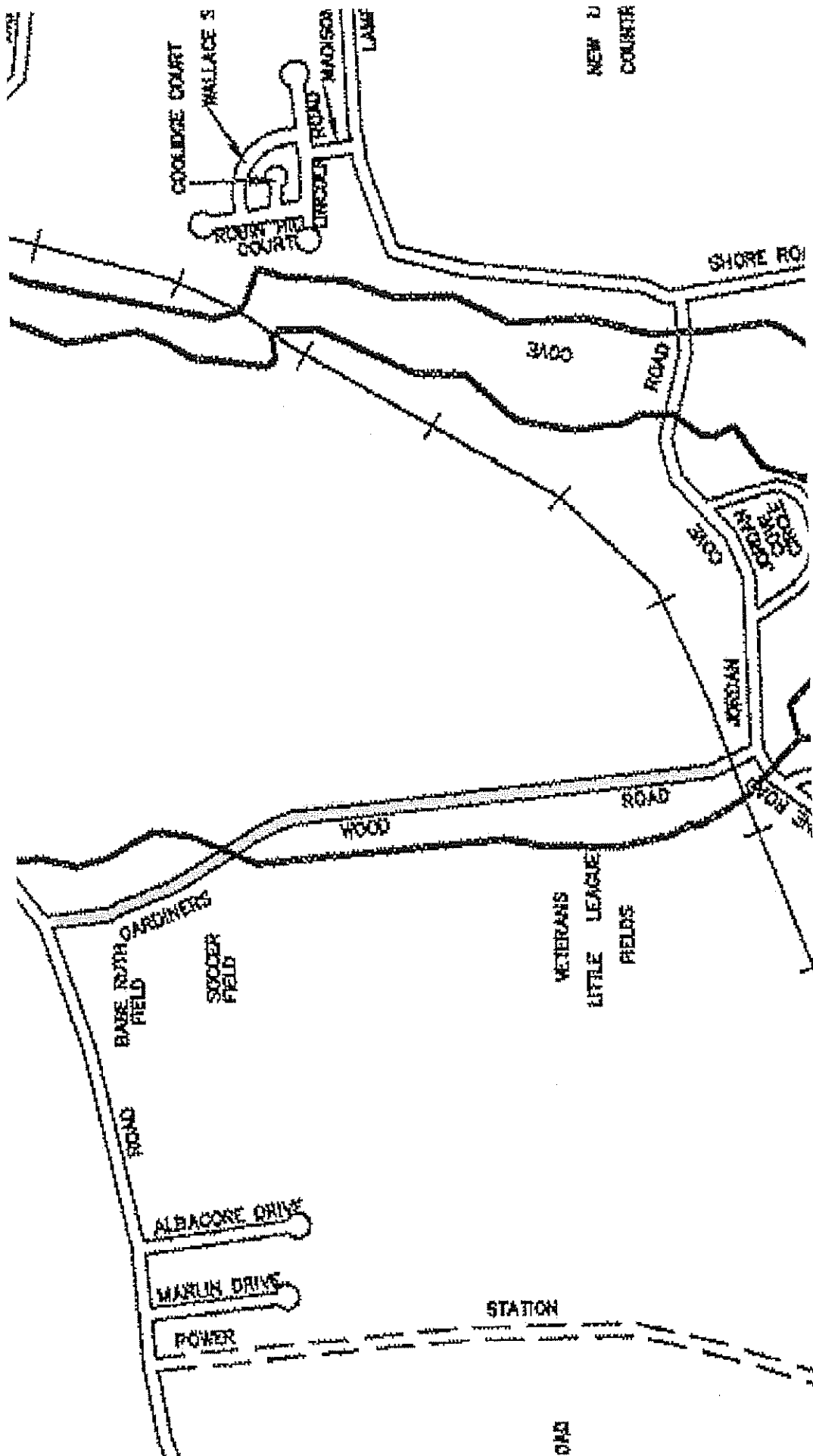

Third Quarter explanations for transfers:

#1 to #2. This is the normal quarterly transfer of labor from Highway Maintenance to Refuse Collection. FY 23 budget has eliminated the need for these quarterly transfers.

#1 to #3. The snow budget was estimated using the average from the last three years of expenditures. This year we experienced 13 call outs. The Highway Maintenance has 2 staff opening (due to retirements) for more than 6 months and we hired in at the lowest level, thus the overage in Snow overtime can be covered by a transfer from Highway Maintenance.

#1 to #4. This line item covers emergency call outs (example tree in road, Emergency CBYD, etc.) and the Saturday openings of the Transfer Station. Three events (rain storm and tropical storms) cleanups required overtime in response to the events. The request is calculated to account for the remaining Saturday openings of the Transfer Station until the end of the year.

#5 to #6. The Professional Fees line is over due to unexpected expenses for personnel issues (HR), Engineering inspections for 2 bridges after a significant rain storm, and OSHA mandate audiology tests for employees.
